With the kick-off of 4 new European projects and signing a Memorandum of Understanding with the FAO, Learning Journeys in Turkey and Lebanon jointly implemented with Terre et Humanisme and supported by the FAO under their South-South Co-operation programme,, participation in the Organic World Conference in India, FAO Symposiums on Sustainable Food Systems and Nutrition, in two different regions, the launch of a seed-saving and seed swapping initiative in China, the finalisation of our mapping of LSPA in West Africa, participation in the IPES-Food initiative on a Common Food Policy for Europe, as well as many more activities in which our team has been involved, we are happy and fulfilled but also seriously overwhelmed by the sheer amount of work to be done right now. So watch this space: we plan to restructure and enlarge the team in early 2018! We will soon send you an update on the new members and their responsibilities.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



30 October 2017 will remain a singular moment in the history of Urgenci, the network of Community Supported Agriculture. A 3-year Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the President of the International Committee, Judith Hitchman, and Daniel Gustafson, Deputy Director General, at the United Nations' FAO Headquarters in Rome. This is an important recognition for all the local and solidarity partnerships between consumers and producers, and for Urgenci as their legitimate representative organization. Mediterranean Learning Journeys: Turkey, Lebanon and follow up 2018

Back in 2015, FAO supported Urgenci's work on an initial pilot project aimed at "supporting the exchange of good practices between already existing alternative food distribution systems and increasing capacity of rural and urban citizens on sustainable food distribution systems in the Mediterranean area" (Dec 2015-April 2016). Thanks to Moroccan RIAM, AMAP de Provence and Terre & Humanisme, we started a Mediterranean network for Local and Solidarity Partnerships for Agroecology (LSPA). A first meeting was convened in Marseilles in February 2016, with encouraging outcomes. After collective efforts to get support for follow-up, Urgenci and its partners managed to organised, as

planned together, two Learning Journeys in 2017: <u>Ankara in October, hosted by DBB</u> and Tadya collective and <u>Lebanon in</u> <u>November</u>, hosted by the Soils Permaculture association Lebanon. These field trips were aimed at facilitating "exchange of good practices between small-scale food producers and consumers

on already existing alternative food distribution systems", in order to support "capacity development-oriented learning activities" in 2018.

Indeed, the MedNet was granted a further budget for 2018 in order to 'develop a modular training programme serving training activities in the Mediterranean basin: *yalla*!
